#### 2.15 Plan of action by IQAC/Outcome

The plan of action chalked out by the IQAC in the beginning of the year towards quality enhancement and the outcome achieved by the end of the year \*

#### I. To organize an Orientation Program for new comers in the beginning of the session.

The IQAC of the college organized an orientation program 'KNOW YOUR COLLEGE' for new comers in the beginning of the session. In this program students of first year of UG(science, arts and commerce) classes in different groups were acquainted with the rule and regulation of the college, code of conduct for students, time-table and about the various facilities available in the college.

#### II. Promoting the use of Technology

IQAC ensured that the following facilities are available during the session.

- The facility of air conditioned NCR equipped with one projector and 11 computers, enriched with e-resources and internet facility for students and staff.
- Five roof- fitted LCD projectors have been installed in different class rooms and one mobile projector is allotted in the department of computer application for ready use in any department of the college for teachers.
- The accounts office and the Examination branch of the college has initiated online process in few area dealing with students, staff, university and management using computer software.
- The library has facility to access the e- resources such as N-LIST Subscription and open resources, automation using software E-granthalya, BSNL and Connect internet broadband connection is available for internet facility for the staff and students.

#### III. Promotion of Research

- IQAC held meetings with the various committees to keeps track of the schemes of various bodies.
- IQAC encourages the faculty members to publish research articles/books and to undertake the Major/Minor research projects in their fields of interest for academic advancement. During this academic year, teachers of different departments have authored four books with ISSN numbers and published eleven research papers in journals of national/international repute. Nine teachers have attended various national/international conferences, workshops and seminars.
- IQAC encourage the faculty to go for higher education /research in their field of interest. Some teachers have already completed their Ph.D. Two teachers Mr. Narinder Sharma and Mr. Subash Chander Gupta have been already enrolled for it and are doing their research at present with full enthusiasm. During the year, Mr. Narinder Sharma, Associate Professor of English got approval of his Ph.D Synopsis on 10<sup>th</sup> October 2017 at Uttra Khand Open University, Haldwani.

#### IV. Environment Consciousness

- The college NSS Units/department of botany actively participates in creating awareness of environmental hazards and the urgent need to keep the environment Clean, Green & Pollution Free.
- On the World Environment day (5<sup>th</sup> June,2018) 'Tree Plantation and Beat Plastic Pollution' programme was observed by IQAC in collaboration with the department of Botany. Energy conservation strategies like Minimum use of Electricity( Lights and Fans) was also adopted in the college campus.
- Under Swachh Bharat Abhyian, NSS volunteers and NCC Cadets regularly lead campaigns of cleanliness, prevent in use of polythene and polythene products in the college campus.

#### V. Extra Curricular Activities:

During the academic year, different departments and clubs in the college organized 21 activities and there was significant participation in co- curricular activities where our students have shown their brilliance and won several prizes in various competitions held at colleges around the state. The detail of activities organized/participation of students are listed in Annexure-I

#### VI. Promotion of Sports

Athletic Meet is an annual feature of the college to promote sports. The 45<sup>th</sup> annual athletic meet was held on 27<sup>th</sup> & 28<sup>th</sup> February 2018 under the leadership of Ms. Iqbal Kaur, Head Department of Physical Education and her team. **Dr. Jagpal Singh Vice-Chanceller of Guru Kashi University** was the chief guest at this athletic function. Mr. Siddharth Sharma was the Best Athlete among the boys and Ms.

Sandeep Kaur was the Best Athlete among the girl students. In the field of sports, there was significant participation in the sports activities where our students won several prizes in addition to 9 Gold 8 Silver and 28 Bronze Medals at district/university level in various competitions. The detail of participation and achievements in sports are mentioned in Annexure-III

#### VII. Increase in amenities and facility

- The college staff room has been renovated with the installation of A.C and two computers/laptop with internet facility for the staff members.
- The construction work at the seminar room is in progress and hopefully will be completed soon in the next session.

- Curriculum Development is undertaken by the affiliating University. The various teaching departments of the college forward their inputs through the faculty members who are nominated as members of Board of Studies by the University.
- Four of our teachers are members of Board of Studies in Panjab university so they are instrumental/participate in curriculum development and modifications by the University from time to time.

#### **6.3.2 Teaching & Learning**

- The College provides infrastructural support to improve teaching learning process as required by the teaching departments. The Staff and the students are encouraged to adopt non-conventional and latest pedagogical practices.
- The faculties of each department meet at the beginning of each academic session for term-wise allocation of syllabus, assignments and class tests/evaluation process for the semester and follow the academic calendar of that session prescribed by Panjab University.
- Technology enabled Teaching Learning process practiced in college. LCD projectors, overhead projectors, are used for teaching regularly. Field study and Practical file work carried out by some of the departments of the College.
- To enlighten students on diverse aspects of knowledge, Seminars and guest lectures are organised by different departments.
- Students of Punjabi/English department are shown films based on the texts prescribed in their syllabus.
- Conduct of remedial/merit classes for slow learners.

- Provision of rich study material and e-resources in library and NRC with free internet facility. arrangement of field trips and industrial visits by some departments.
- To take feedback of students so as to improve teaching learning process by way of feedback forms and suggestion box.
- To organize co-curricular competitions like quiz, debates & other competitions.

#### **6.3.2** Examination and Evaluation

- Regular class tests/assignments are given for evaluation of students.
- One house test in each semester is conducted before the final semester examination by the examination branch of the college. The answer scripts of the house tests are shown to the students so as to familiarize them with their flaws and encourage them to work hard.
- The Class teachers brief the students on the process of evaluation/internal assessment, internal and external examinations etc.
- Special classes are organized by most of the departments before university examination. Timely notifications are put up and announcements are also made with regard to the examination dates and other relevant information.
- The College follows the rules and regulations regarding examination and evaluation as stipulated by the affiliating university, Panjab University, Chandigarh.

- Teachers are kept updated about available scopes for applying for research grants. The college provides duty leave to faculty as per norms to attend different International/ National Conferences

- Facility of internet, NLIST Subscription for access to e-resources is available to the staff & students to facilitate smooth progress and implementation of research schemes/projects.
